2018 TEXAS OIL & NATURAL GAS VITAL STATISTICS

Dear Representative Krause,

The Texas Oil & Gas Association (TXOGA) appreciates the role you have in maintaining the State's economic strength. Our industry remains a major force in Texas' prosperity and provides significant funding for government statewide. **In fiscal year 2018, we paid over \$14 billion in state and local taxes and state royalties – that's the equivalent of \$38 million each day. And since 2007, we've paid over \$133 billion.** These revenues go towards funding our public schools and universities, building and repairing roads, and supporting first responders. Additionally, the Texas oil and natural gas industry is providing some of the best-paying jobs in Texas, protecting the environment and securing our status as the nation's leader in oil and natural gas production, pipeline miles and refining capacity. **Economists estimate oil and natural gas represents 29% of Texas' Gross State Product.**
