2022 TEXAS OIL & NATURAL GAS VITAL STATISTICS

Dear Representative Rosenthal,

On the economic front, Fiscal Year 2022 was a record-breaking blockbuster year for tax revenue from the oil and natural gas industry – money that will go to work for the people of Texas. **The Texas oil and natural gas industry paid \$24.7 billion in state and local taxes and state royalties – the highest total in history. This revenue from oil and natural gas production, pipelines, refineries and liquified natural gas (LNG) facilities translates to roughly \$67 million a day. And since 2007, industry has paid over \$203 billion.** These revenues go towards funding our teachers, public schools and universities, building and repairing roads and other infrastructure, and supporting first responders and other essential services. Additionally, the Texas oil and natural gas industry is providing some of the best-paying jobs in Texas, fortifying our energy security and leading the way in innovation and investment that is advancing environmental progress.
